It is subject to change, depending on the guidelines provided by governmental health authorities.

HEALTH PASS



Access to Maison&Objet will be mandatory with a health pass, or on presentation:

- the result of a PCR or antigenic test (less than 48 hours or 72 hours depending on instructions transmitted by health authorities) that did not result in covid-19 contamination,
- Proof of administration of a vaccine (2 doses) against covid-19,
- Any documentation of recovery from contamination by covid-19

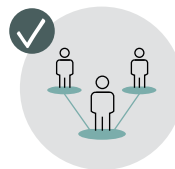
MASK-WEARING REQUIRED

Mask distribution machines will be available on-site.



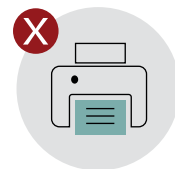
HAND SANITIZER

Contactless disinfection posts will be found throughout the fair and in common areas.



COMPLIANCE WITH MAX.OCCUPANCY AND TRAFFIC REGULATION

- compliance with maximum occupancy
- floor markings
- direction of traffic
- physical distancing
- aisles at least 3 m width



ACCESS BADGES

- pre-registration **mandatory**
- no printing on site, remember to do it before your arrival

SANITARY FACILITIES

- specific signposting
- reminders of sanitary regulations and safety measures to follow



CLEANING

- enhanced disinfection of high-traffic areas

Separated waste bins for proper waste management.
