HEALTH PASS



Access to Maison&Objet will be mandatory with a health pass. What we call "health pass" in France corresponds to the "digital green certificate" or "European Covid-19 certificate". It includes three documents to be presented as desired:

- A proof of a negative RT-PCR or antigenic test, less than 72 hours
- or a Covid-19 recovery certificate, minimum of 11 days old and less than 6 months
- or a vaccination certificate (Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, AstraZeneca, Johnson&Johnson)
